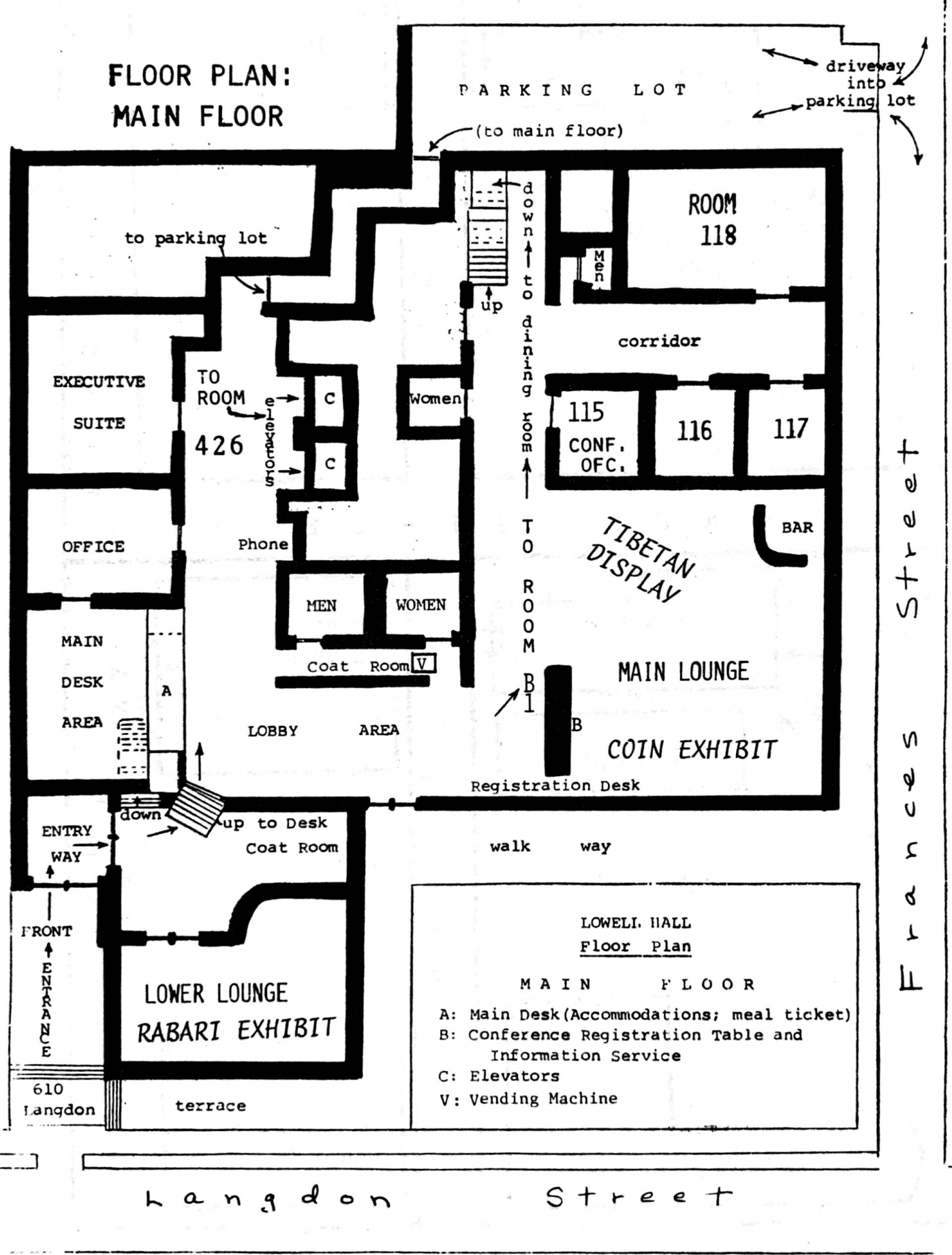

FLOOR PLAN: MAIN FLOOR



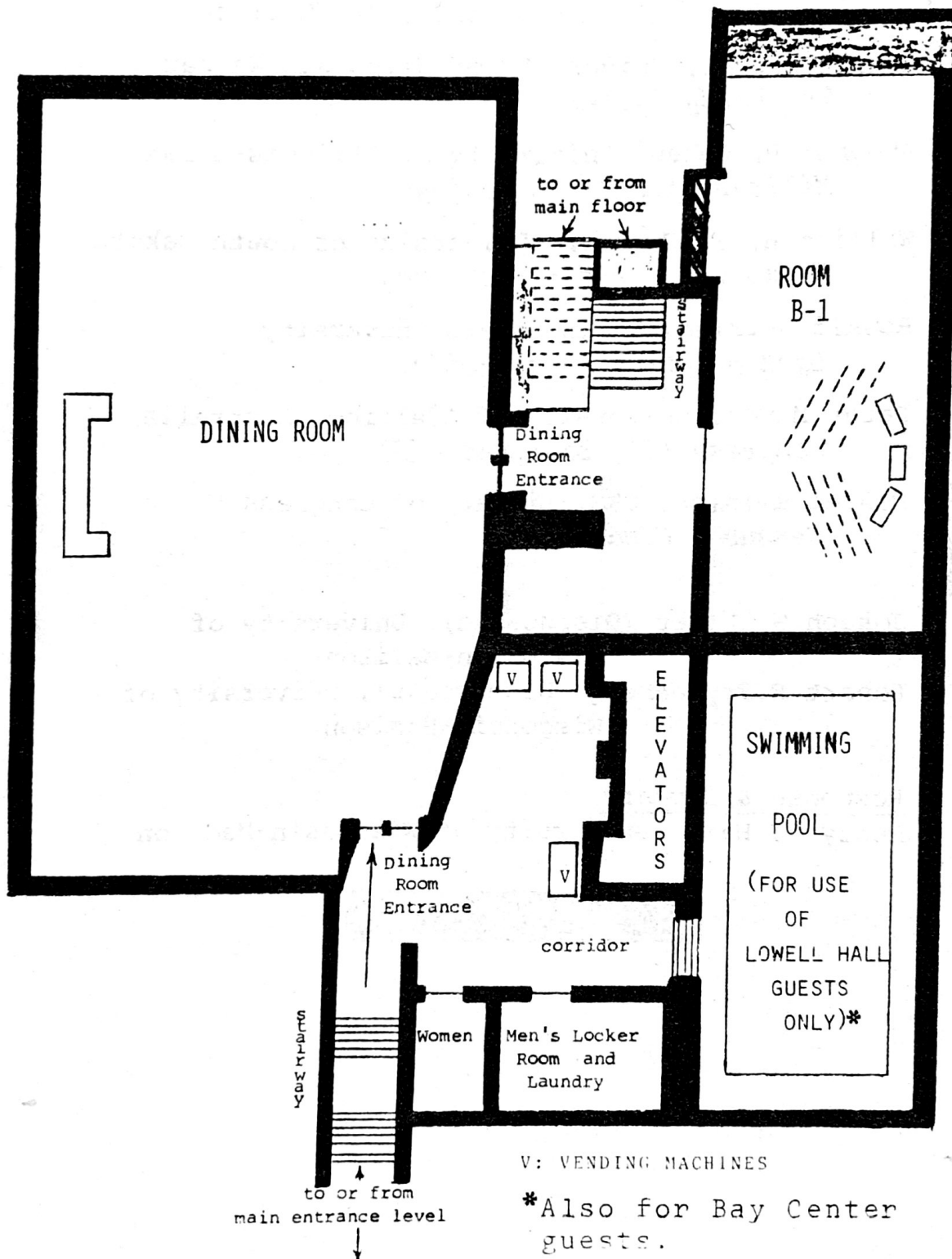

The miniature painting reproduced on our cover is presented courtesy of the Elvehjem Museum of Art, University of Wisconsin-Madison, gift of Mrs. Earnest C. Watson.

Entitled "The Hoopoe", the painting is #20 in the collection of Earnest C. Watson & Jane Werner Watson and is painted in the Mughal Style, c. 1610. The actual size of the miniature is 8-5/8 x 7 inches. The Watson Collection Catalogue describes it this way: "The Bird is painted against a background of pink rocks, a gold sky, and a maple tree with sinuous trunk. The gold appears to have been repainted and the underdrawing of what could have been an earlier study or version is visible in some places, particularly beneath the rocks in front of the bird's chest."

The complete Watson Collection catalogue, including numerous illustrations, has been published by the Elvehjem Museum of Art entitled Indian Miniature Painting (Madison: University of Wisconsin Press, 1971). It features introductory articles on Indian miniature painting, the history of its development and the Krishna myth in Indian miniatures.
