In the modern era of rapid communication, no country can escape the fate of being a multi-ethnic, multi-religious or multi-lingual society. In the case of contemporary South Asia, the context of history, of old civilization & of current uneven development patterns has generated pressure leading to acute ethnic, regional, gender & class conflicts. The colonial heritage has given rise to legal & political institutions which often hinder equal participation. Centralized models of development have often led to authoritarianism that limits the human rights & political participation.

This conference examines the complex issues of differing political frameworks, interest representation, institutional rigidity & policy priorities in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh & Sri Lanka. The Conference will focus on situations of perceived oppression & the varieties of possible political responses to such perceived

oppression.
